We are all G.I.R.L.s!

It is hard to believe how much can change in one year. From day-to-day, progress often appears minimal and it is easy to get frustrated, but when you put it all together, you realize those small steps result in a significant journey.

This year's journey for the Girl Scouts of the Jersey Shore included the retirement of Susan H. McClure, the council's chief executive officer for the past 18 years. Sue's dedication to the Girl Scout mission is an example to which we should all aspire. A new journey has now begun, with new leadership, and day-by-day we are eagerly embracing the future, a future for the Girl Scouts of the Jersey Shore that is both bright and exciting.

The annual changes faced by Girl Scouts are no different than those of any other organization. Girl Scouts has weathered the storm for more than a century because we are the best at what we do – we help girls become women of courage, confidence and character who make the world a better place.

Girl Scouts stands the test of time because we adapt as times change. Today, Girl Scouts creates partnerships with corporations, foundations and individuals to provide digital experiences –experiences that couldn't have been imagined 10 years ago, let alone 100 years ago. These partnerships, with industry leaders at the national and local level, utilize the technology, resources and talents necessary to provide girls with the opportunities they need to find success in their adult lives.

Why are partnerships so important? Let's face it. The world needs more Girl Scouts.

A recent survey by the World Economic Forum found that 86 percent of respondents believe we are suffering a global leadership crisis. To go along with that, the gender balance in positions of power remains lopsided, and many barriers to women achieving leadership positions remain.

Across the country, only a small percentage of the most important 21st century jobs are filled by women:

- \cdot 14% of engineering occupations,
- · 27% of energy jobs,
- 27% of positions in the environmental and geological sciences,
- · 30% of jobs in tech, and
- 38% of land planning and real estate development positions.

It is imperative that we address this gender imbalance, which is exactly what Girl Scouts does every day. On a day-to-day basis, it is difficult to see the effect we make, but put it all together and the Girl Scout difference is obvious.

- · 50% of female business leaders are Girl Scouts,
- · 80% of female tech leaders are Girl Scouts, and
- 76% of female U.S. Senators are Girl Scouts

These women found success in the world because of the effort made at the local level by Girl Scout councils like the Girl Scouts of the Jersey Shore and all the people like you who support us.

MEMBERSHIP IMPACT

- During the 2016-2017 membership year, the Girl Scouts of the Jersey Shore served 10,413 girl members and 3,756 adult members.
- Our Girl Scouts belonged to 1,082 troops.
- Through our iGirl program for individual Girl Scouts, 684 girls participated in Girl Scout activities, making new friends along the way.
- In our under-served communities, 285 girls joined Girl Scouts, discovering leadership skills that will help them achieve their dreams.
- The council trained 955 adults; 440 through in-person training and 515 through online courses.
- The council honored 192 individuals with a variety of council awards, recognizing the hard work and effort of its volunteers and community partners.

ADULT MEMBERSHIP AGE RANGE





Last year, go-getting Girl Scout entrepreneurs ran the largest girl-led business in the world. In Monmouth and Ocean counties, girls sold more than one million boxes of Girl Scout Cookies to finance activities like travel, camping and community service projects. The Girl Scout Cookie program helped girls gain the skills needed to run a business, teaching them how to set goals, market their product and confidently interact with customers. OUR COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Every year, the Girl Scouts of the Jersey Shore hosts multiple events to better engage the community in the Girl Scout mission. Money earned benefits Girl Scout programs and opportunities in Monmouth and Ocean counties, ensuring every girl who wants to be a Girl Scout can be a Girl Scout.

SPECIAL EVENT IMPACT

- The council hosted its 2nd annual Dancing with Our Monmouth and Ocean County Stars event. Dancing with our Monmouth & Ocean County Stars raised \$73,205 with 238 guests in attendance.
- The 29th annual Women of Distinction and Community Partners Gala raised \$132,693 with 218 guests in attendance.
- Teeing off at the Girl Scout Golf Classic were 84 golfers who helped raise \$39,263 for the council.
- The council finished its year with its 2nd annual Phenomenal Women Under 40 Awards which honored 10 Monmouth and Ocean county young business leaders. The event raised \$33,251 with an attendance of 208 guests.

SIGNATURE PROGRAM IMPACT

- · More than 1,000 guests scared up an incredibly fun time at the council's annual Spooktacular event. This not-so-scary fall festival is planned and implemented by teen Girl Scouts in grades 7-12.
- · Sleeping amid wild animals is a dream for many people. 269 girls and their mothers had the chance to do just that during the council's annual sleepover in the treehouse at the Philadelphia Zoo.
- · They're a craze across the country; for the first time the Girl Scouts hosted their own Color Run at Camp Sacajawea. More than 110 people participated in this now-annual spring celebration.
- · More than 100 children of all ages also had the chance to eat Breakfast with Santa at the Program Activity Center. This annual winter event includes a sleigh ride through camp and a chance to meet a Victorian Santa and his wife.

She thinks outside the box.

While many girls begin to lose interest in science and math as early as middle school, Girl Scouts captures girls' natural curiosity and creativity, helping girls unleash their inner innovators through hands-on experiences and career exploration in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM). The idea is to learn by doing, and as Girl Scouts, they do lots of it, growing more confident along the way.

PROGRAM IMPACT

- · During the 2016-2017 membership year, the Girl Scouts of the Jersey Shore offered 370 council programs to 10,611 participants.
- · Travel is an exciting part of the Girl Scout experience. 47 girls participated in national or international trips organized by the council or their troops.
- · 41 Girl Scouts applied for the Kiefer-Stevens Scholarship. 14 girls received a combined \$15,000, based on their applications.
- · At Amity Acres Day Camp and Sacajawea Day Camp, 1,183 girls discovered the thrill that comes from a summer outdoors while enjoying 3,515 combined weeks of camp.
